UA 185/94 Possible "disappearance" / Fear for safety 11 May 1994

COLOMBIARafael BENITEZ ORREGO, aged 23, salesman and political activist Nelson BENITEZ ORREGO, aged 20, driver and political activist

Rafael and Nelson Benítez Orrego have not been seen since they were violently abducted by armed men on 5 May 1994 in the town of Dabeiba, in the Urabá region of Antioquia department.

According to sources, a group of armed men who identified themselves as members of a paramilitary group known as "The Professionals", "Los Profesionales", forced the two men into a vehicle and drove them to an unknown destination. Their whereabouts are still not known and there is serious concern for their safety.

Rafael Benítez and his brother Nelson Benítez are both active members of the Colombian Communist Party, Partido Comunista Colombiano (PCC). Although political parties and independent organizations are free to operate in Colombia, members of all political parties have been victims of human rights violations including illegal detention, torture, "disappearance" and extrajudicial execution because of their political views and activism.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Urabá region of Antioquia department is located in the north-west of Colombia. For many years querrilla groups have been active in the region and, as a result, there is a high presence there of both military and army-backed paramilitary groups. Many paramilitary groups have their origins in the civilian "self-defence" squads which the army created in the 1980s to act as auxiliaries during counter-insurgency operations. Over the past five years, several thousand civilians have been killed by paramilitary groups throughout the country. Although in 1989 the Colombian government suspended the legal base for the formation of paramilitary organizations and issued directives to the Colombia armed forces to combat and disband such groups, paramilitary forces have continued to kill and "disappear" perceived opponents with impunity in many areas of the country and continue to work with the support of the security forces. Although illegal paramilitary activity is principally centred on rural areas of guerrilla influence, "hit squads" - small groups of gunmen - have frequently been despatched to the cities to assassinate left-wing political activists, trade union leaders, human rights activists and national political

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters either in Spanish or in your own language:

- expressing concern at the violent abduction and possible "disappearance" of brothers Rafael and Nelson Benítez Orrego on 5 May 1994 and urging that there be an immediate inquiry into their whereabouts;
- urging that if they are in detention, that they be humanely treated and allowed access to lawyers and to their relatives;
- urging that if in detention, that they be charged with a recognizable criminal offence or immediately released;
- urging that the government should immediately fulfil its commitment to disband paramilitary forces presently operating as auxiliaries of the armed forces or with armed forces' complicity. Members of such forces responsible for human rights violations should be brought to justice.
