MEXICO: María Teresa Jardí, female, human rights lawyer

Amnesty International is seriously concerned at reports of death threats against María Teresa Jardí, Director of the Department of Solidarity and Defence of Human Rights in the Archdiocesis of Mexico (Directora del Departamento de Solidaridad y Defensa de los Derechos Humanos de la Arquidiócesis de México) and legal adviser to the Chihuahua-based human rights group, Commission of Solidarity and Defence of Human Rights (COSYDDHAC, Comisión de Solidaridad y Defensa de los Derechos Humanos).

The renowned human rights lawyer has received three written death threats in the last few days. The letters warned her that if she did not stop her human rights work, she and her family would suffer the consequences. One of the threats refers to her investigations into the murder of Víctor Manuel Oropeza, a journalist and political activist, who was killed in July 1991. He had received death threats prior to his murder after publishing a series of articles criticising the judicial police and a former Deputy Attorney General in charge of anti-narcotics investigations, for a series of alleged abuses.

BACKGROUND

Several other human rights activists have received death threats in recent years. In May 1990, Norma Corona Sapién, a human rights lawyer and president of a human rights commission in the State of Sinaloa, was killed by unidentified gunmen. At the time of her assassination she was investigating the murders of four people, who had reportedly been abducted and tortured by the federal judicial police. In March 1990, she had announced that she was receiving death threats because of these investigations.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes, preferably in Spanish or in your own language:

- expressing serious concern about the death threats received by María Teresa Jardí and urging immediate measures to guarantee her physical integrity;
- urging an immediate investigation into the threats and that those responsible be brought to justice.
