





Dear Secretary Sebelius,

The USA is facing a maternal health crisis. In the USA, a woman's lifetime risk of maternal death is greater than in 40 other countries. African-American women are nearly four times more likely to die than white women.

Your agency must be at the heart of efforts to improve maternal health outcomes. I urge you to work with President Obama to create an Office of Maternal Health that at a minimum will:

- recommend regulatory and legislative changes to ensure quality maternal care for all women;
- ensure comprehensive data collection and effective nationwide review;
- ensure access to timely prenatal care;
- issue evidence-based protocols to prevent, recognize and respond to the leading pregnancy complications;
- encourage home visits after childbirth; and
- vigorously enforce federal non-discrimination laws.
