Further information (1) on UA 23/96 (ASA 16/06/96, 1 February 1996) - Fear of Ill-treatment / Legal concern

MYANMARU Win Naing, 32 U Khin Maung U Thein Tun, 56 U Maung Maung Lay, 50 Aung Myint, formerly U Maung Ung Myient U Htay, Kywe, 40

Amnesty International has recently learned that U Maung Maung Lay, a 50-year-old lawyer, and Aung Myint, a National League for Democracy (NLD) youth member, were released on 1 February 1996. It it not known why they were released. The other four men are still detained and awaiting trial, which has been postponed from its original date of 5 February, but the new trial date is not known. The six men were originally arrested for writing a poem to commemorate the fifth anniversary of the death in custody of their NLD colleague U Tin Maung Win.

While Amnesty International welcomes the release of U Maung Maung Lay and Aung Myint, it is concerned at reports that Aung Myint was subjected to ill-treatment while in detention. He was reportedly slapped, punched, and beaten with bamboo sticks. His current state of health is not known.

**Note:** Aung Myint's name was originally reported as U Maung Ung Myient, which may have been an alias, or could be a difference in the transliteration of Burmese script.

## FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/airmail letters in English or in your own language:

- welcoming the releases of U Maung Maung Lay and Aung Myint, as they were probably prisoners of conscience, detained solely for peacefully exercising their rights to freedom of expression;
- repeating fears that the remaining four may also prisoners of conscience and appealing for their immediate and unconditional release;
- expressing concern at reports that Aung Myint was ill-treated, and calling on the Myanmar authorities to ensure that no one is ill-treated while in detention;
- expressing concern at the continuing detention, apparently without charge or trial, of dozens of NLD members.
