MYANMARU Win Thein; Dr. Aung Khin Sint, and some 90 other NLD activists, including at least six women

Amnesty International has obtained the names of some 90 National League for Democracy (NLD) activists who have been arrested in the last three days. Arrests are continuing hourly. The vast majority of those arrested are NLD members of parliament-elect. However U Win Htein, the current NLD spokesman and a former prisoner of conscience released in February 1995, is not an MP. He was taken from his home at 10pm on 21 May 1996 to an unknown location. When he asked the arresting officers for a warrant, he was told that a warrant was not needed as charges had already been brought against him. Dr Aung Khin Sint, another former prisoner of conscience who was also released in February 1995, has been re-arrested as well.

Amnesty International does not know where these 90 people are being held and fears that they may be subjected to ill-treatment and torture. Evidently no charges have yet been brought against them. The group was arrested solely for planning to attend a peaceful meeting and should be released immediately and unconditionally.

In spite of these arrests, the NLD is still planning to hold a conference from 26-29 May, because, according to Daw Aung San Suu Kyi: "our elected representatives still have a duty to the people who elected them. We are the only party with a mandate from the people." NLD Chairman U Aung Shwe also sent a letter of protest about the arrests to the State Law and Order Restoration Council, but has not received a reply.

The wives of the two MP's who had been arrested in their place have now been released.

- urging that they be immediately and unconditionally released
