AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL HOLDS HONG KONG PRESS CONFERENCE ON HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATIONS IN CHINA

Amnesty International's Secretary General, Pierre Sané, is in Hong Kong to launch a worldwide campaign and comprehensive report on human rights violations in China – the second stop in a campaigning tour which includes Bangkok and Tokyo.

At the press conference, the Secretary General will spotlight the responsibility of businesses to protect and promote human rights in China, and the vested interest of businesses investing in China to ensure that the Chinese government upholds the rule of law.

He will also discuss the role of governments in standing up to Chinese pressure to prevent international scrutiny of its human rights record, and Amnesty International's response to attempts to silence the organization's message.

During his stay in Hong Kong, the Secretary General is seeking meetings with representatives of the Chinese government. He is also meeting representatives of the Hong Kong Legislative Council, the General Chamber of Commerce and the US and Dutch Chambers of Commerce.
