# Further information on UA 39/96 (ASA 20/06/96, 16 February 1996) and follow-ups (ASA 20/14/96, 25 March and ASA 20/20/96, 16 May) - Death Penalty

### INDIA Gantela Vijayavardhana Rao, aged 25 Satuluri Chalapathi Rao, aged 24

On 29 August 1996, the Supreme Court dismissed an appeal and upheld the death sentences passed on Gantela Vijayavardhana Rao and Satuluri Chalapathi Rao. No date has yet been set for their execution.

### FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/ airmail letters in English or in your own language:

urging that the death sentences on Gantela Vijayavardhana Rao and Satuluri Chalapathi Rao not be carried out and that their sentences be commuted;
expressing unconditional opposition to the death penalty as a violation of the right to life and the right not to be subjected to cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment as proclaimed in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights;

- pointing out that the death penalty has never been shown to have a unique deterrent effect.
