INDIA Gantela Vijayavardhana Rao, aged 25 Satuluri Chalapathi Rao, aged 24

Gantela Vijayavardhana Rao and Satuluri Chalapathi Rao will soon be hanged in the first judicial executions to take place in Andhra Pradesh for 17 years, unless the President of India commutes their death sentences.

The High Court of Andhra Pradesh at Hyderabad had stayed their execution, which was scheduled to take place on 30 September, acting on a writ petition filed by the Andhra Pradesh Civil Liberties Committee (APCLC). The petition, filed on 25 September, had called for a stay to allow the Governor of Andhra Pradesh and the President of India time to decide on the mercy petitions, filed by the two men, appealing for commutation of their sentences.

Following the refusal of the appeal by the Governor of Andhra Pradesh, the petition was dismissed on 5 November by a bench headed by Chief Justice Prabha Shankar Mishra. Another mercy petition is being submitted to the President of India urging him to exercise his powers under Article 72 of the Constitution of India to commute the death sentence.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/airmail letters in English or in your own language:

- urging that the death sentences on Gantela Vijayavardhana Rao and Satuluri Chalapathi Rao not be carried out and that their sentences be commuted;
- expressing unconditional opposition to the death penalty as a violation of the right to life and the right not to be subjected to cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment as proclaimed in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights;
- pointing out that the death penalty has never been shown to have a unique deterrent effect.
