# Further information on MEDICAL LETTER WRITING ACTION Muchtar Pakpahan INDONESIA

## Keywords

Theme: prisoner of conscience / ill-health / denial of medical treatment

## **Summary**

In February 1997, Al issued a medical action on Muchtar Pakpahan, aged 44, and Petrus Hariyanto, aged 26, who were both reported to be denied adequate medical care in Cipinang Prison in Jakarta. Both men are adopted prisoners of conscience. There have been further developments regarding the medical treatment for Muchtar Pakpahan, who is suffering from a benign tumour on one of his lungs.

The Indonesian Attorney-General Singgih announced on 21 July 1997 that the government had rejected a request for Muchtar Pakpahan to receive treatment overseas, after an assessment by government-appointed doctors. Singgih was reported as saying:

"According to the procedures, a second opinion was asked for from the Department of Health which formed a team of doctors. The results said the illness from which he was suffering was not fatal and could be treated here". (AFP 22 July 1997).

The doctors reported that Muchtar Pakpahan was suffering from a long-term infection of his right lung which "could have been caused by TB, bacteria or fungus". Singgih announced that Muchtar Pakpahan's trial should resume because he was considered well enough to attend court, even if this meant that he needed to be "accompanied by 100 doctors" [Bernas, 22 July 1997].

The Indonesian Medical Association has stated publicly that Muchtar Pakpahan is entitled to a third opinion on his health and on whether he should be sent overseas to receive medical treatment. The Association's Chair, Azrul Azwar, was reported as saying "If he is dissatisfied with the results of the previous medical checks, he can ask for a third opinion" (AFP 30 July 1997). The Association has not, however, called for Pakpahan to be allowed to travel abroad for treatment, but their call, coming from a domestic professional body, is significant.

Following the Attorney-General's announcement that Muchtar Pakpahan does not require medical treatment overseas, the judge presiding over his trial, Jude Djazuli P Sudibyo, was quoted in *Kompas* (23 July 1997) as questioning how a court could subject a defendant who was sick to a trial. He was reported to have said that a "*trial is conditional on the good health of the defendant. It is difficult for the defendant to defend themselves if they are sick."* 

Muchtar Pakpahan remains in Cikini Private Hospital in Jakarta.

## **Recommended actions**

Letters from health professionals in your personal or professional capacity *without mention of Amnesty International* should continue to the addresses below. Letters can be in English or your own language and should:

oexpress continuing concern at the detention of Muchtar Pakpahan, stating your belief that he is a prisoner of conscience who has neither advocated nor used violence

onote that you are aware that Muchtar Pakpahan has a serious though benign lung tumour ocalling for the trial not to be resumed while Muchtar Pakpahan remains unwell

ocall for his immediate and unconditional release and permission for him to seek medical care as recommended by his medical advisers
