CAMBODIA Kim San (m), human rights worker

Meas Minear (m), human rights worker

On 20 January 1999, the Appeals Court in Phnom Penh ordered the immediate release of Kim San and Meas Minear, due to a lack of evidence against them.

Amnesty International believes that the charges against the two human rights workers, of robbery and damage to property, were politically motivated. Defenders of the two men are calling for all charges to be dropped.

Kim San and Meas Minear, who work for the Cambodian League for the Defence of Human Rights (LICADHO), were detained in Sihanoukville on 21 December 1998. They had been monitoring demonstrations in the town against the dumping of toxic waste in the area by a Taiwanese company.

Amnesty International welcomes the Appeals Court's decision as an important step in asserting the independence of the judiciary and in the protection of human rights workers peacefully carrying out their duties.
