Amnesty International has been informed that Mohamed Latheef was transferred from Male' police headquarters to house arrest in mid-October. He is said to have been extremely weak at the time of his transfer and could barely walk. There is continuing grave concern, particularly given his age, over his state of health.

Amnesty International continues to be concerned about Ahamed Shafeeq and Ali Moosa Didi who remain under house arrest.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/faxes/airmail letters in English or your own language:

expressing concern about the continued detention of Mohamed Latheef, Ahamed Shafeeq and Ali Moosa Didi and about their state of health;
calling for their immediate and unconditional release if they are not to be promptly charged with recognizable criminal offences;
expressing serious concern at the length of time these detainees have been held without charge or trial.
