EXTRA 30/98 <u>Imminent execution</u> 22 April 1998

PAKISTANMian Khan

Mian Khan, of Chak Jhumra near Faisalabad, Punjab Province, is to be hanged in the district jail of Faisalabad on 23 April 1998.

Mian Khan was convicted of murder and sentenced to death on 9 February 1989 by the district and sessions court in Faisalabad. The provincial High Court and the Supreme Court of Pakistan have both rejected his appeals. On 4 April 1998 the President of Pakistan turned down his appeal for mercy. Mian Khan was subsequently shifted from the central jail to the district jail where his relatives are permitted to have a last meeting with him on 22 April 1998.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Amnesty International unconditionally opposes the use of the death penalty as a violation of the right to life and the right not to be subjected to cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment. In a resolution adopted in April 1997, the UN Commission on Human Rights called on all states that have not yet abolished the death penalty " to consider suspending executions, with a view to completely abolishing the death penalty".

International human rights instruments contain numerous safeguards against the arbitrary application of the death penalty.

- urging that the death penalty be abolished as it violates the right to life and the prohibition of cruel, inhuman and degrading punishment;
- calling on the Government of Pakistan to ratify relevant international human rights instruments such as the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights and its Second Optional Protocol, which aims to abolish of the death penalty.
