UA 178/94 Death Penalty

SOCIALIST REPUBLIC OF VIETNAM

Vu Van Vuong

On 26 April 1994, the Quang Ninh People's Court imposed the death penalty on Vu Van Vuong for "his leading role in the conspiracy to destroy high-voltage power line supports", a criminal offence under Article 94 of the Criminal Procedure Code. He and seven others, who were given jail sentences, were accused of "destroying important national security projects and handling property obtained from other people's criminal activities". Vu Van Vuong may appeal the death sentence to an appellate court.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In Viet Nam, immediately after a death sentence takes legal effect, the court file is sent to the Chief Justice of the Supreme People's Court and a copy of the judgement is also sent to the Chief Procurator of the Supreme Peoples' Organ of Control for review, both of whom must decide within two months whether or not to protest the sentenced imposed by an appellate court. A death sentence is enforced if there is no protest from either official. Within a period of seven days from the time of the death sentence, the convicted person may also submit an appeal for clemency to Viet Nam's President.

In the past, most death sentences have been commuted to jail terms including life imprisonment. The death penalty may be applied as a maximum sentence for around 30 serious criminal offenses including smuggling, treason, espionage, rebellion, murder, rape, defrauding socialist property, and bribery.

Amnesty International opposes the death penalty in all cases on the grounds that it is a violation of the right to life and the right not to be subjected to cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment as proclaimed in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/express and airmail letters in English or your own language:

- expressing concern that Vu Van Vuong has been sentenced to death;
- stating Amnesty International's unconditional opposition to the death penalty;
- urging that all death sentences, including that of Vu Van Vuong, be commuted and that no more death sentences be imposed.
