France: The search for justice PRESS CONFERENCE INVITATION

Amnesty International will present at a press conference in Paris a new report that shows how members of the French police force use torture and ill-treatment and unjustified lethal force against suspects and detainees without fear of being brought to justice.

The organization's latest report *France: The Search for Justice: The effective impunity of law enforcement officers in cases of shootings, deaths in custody or torture and ill-treatment* is based on 20 cases documented over 10 years. It reveals widespread failure of the judicial system to prosecute and punish human rights violations leading to a "two-speed justice" which prosecutes cases brought by police officers far more quickly than those brought by victims of police brutality, who are predominantly people of Arab or African origin.
