TURKMENISTAN Yusup Kuliyev, journalist (in cyrillic )

Yusup Kuliyev has "disappeared". On 20 October 1994, he was reportedly by agents of the Committee for State Security (KGB) at his home in the capital, Ashgabat. No reason was given for his arrest at that time, but it was apparently part of a round-up of known or suspected government opponents who were taken into police custody prior to Turkmenistan's independence day celebrations on 27 October. All the others have since been released. Yusup Kuliyev has not been released, and his family has been unable to obtain any information about his whereabouts.

Turkmenistan's 1992 independence day holiday was similarly preceded by the detention of known or suspected government opponents: the authorities were apparently acting to prevent any possible disruption to celebrations. Government opponents are also frequently detained in Turkmenistan to prevent them meeting visiting foreign dignitaries. These detentions normally last only a few days, however.

Yusup Kuliyev is a former employee of the state newspaper <u>Esh Kommunist</u> (Young Communist), and more recently has worked as an editor at a documentary film studio and as a stringer for the US-financed Radio Liberty (based in Germany).

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Turkmenistan is led by President Saparmurad Niyazov. There are two registered political parties, the Democratic Party (the renamed Communist Party, of which Saparmurad Niyazov is chairman) and the Peasants' Party for Justice, which also supports the President. A rival Democratic Party and the Agzybirlik movement are not officially registered, and their activists have been forced by official harassment to work underground or have gone into exile. In presidential elections in June 1992, Saparmurad Niyazov ran unopposed and was returned to office with 95.5 per cent of the vote. In January 1994 a proposal to extend the President's current term from five to 10 years was overwhelmingly endorsed in a referendum. A cult of personality is being actively promoted around President Niyazov.

## RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters either in Russian, English or in your own language:

- calling on the authorities to clarify the whereabouts of Yusup Kuliyev, and to release him if he is not to be charged with a recognizably criminal offence;
  calling on the authorities to guarantee the physical safety and well being of Yusup Kuliyev, noting that the victims of "disappearance" are especially vulnerable to torture or extrajudicial execution;
- calling on the authorities to put a stop immediately to all forms of harassment and persecution, including short-term detention, of people who have sought peacefully to exercise their fundamental human rights.
