Dear Chief Prosecutor.

I am writing to you to express my deep concern that almost 14 years after the end of the war in Bosnia and Herzegovina the fate and whereabouts of thousands of people are still in doubt.

Dragan Mitrović, Father Tomislav Matanović and Avdo Palić are only three of the thousands of victims of enforced disappearance committed by members of armies, police forces and paramilitary groups involved in the 1992-1995 war.

Impunity continues for enforced disappearances, and the victims of these violations and their relatives have received no justice or redress.

I therefore urge you to complete the investigation into the enforced disappearance of Avdo Palić, Tomislav Matanović, and his parents Josip and Božena Matanović, and to bring the perpetrators to justice.
