The whereabouts of at least 23 followers of Grand Ayatollah Shirazi, detained at various times since September 1995, remain unknown. Fears for their safety in incommunicado detention have been heightened by unconfirmed reports that Sayed Morteza Shirazi, the son of Grand Ayatollah Shirazi, and Mohammad al-Ghaffari have been tortured while in custody. The reports indicate that Muhammad al-Ghaffari was hospitalised for internal bleeding resulting from his alleged torture.

In addition to the 18 men referred to in UA 266/95, five other followers of Grand Ayatollah Shirazi have reportedly been arrested. Sheikh Ja'far Ghani al-Ha'eri was arrested from his home on 30 September and is said to have remained in incommunicado detention ever since. Sheikh Muhammad Saleh Hedayati was arrested in Qom on 17 October. Sayed Abbas Musawi, who works in the office of Grand Ayatollah Shirazi, was reportedly arrested from his home in Qom on 6 December. Ahmad and Jalal Akhound were arrested in Tehran in early January 1996.

Amnesty International remains concerned that the detainees may be held solely on account of their association with Grand Ayatollah Shirazi, a senior religious figure who has opposed certain policies of the Iranian Government. As such they would be prisoners of conscience.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/airmail letters in English, French or your own language or in your own language:

- requesting information about the current whereabouts of these 23 men and anyone else who may be detained because of their connection with Grand Ayatollah Shirazi;

- urging that their families be informed immediately of their whereabouts and that they be granted access to lawyers and doctors of their choice and to a judicial review of their detention;

- seeking information about their legal status, and calling for their release if they are not to be charged with recognizably criminal offences;

expressing concern at reports that Sayed Morteza Shirazi and Mohammad al-Ghaffari have been tortured and calling for a thorough, independent and impartial investigation into the torture allegations;
urging that all detainees are treated humanely and urging that their physical safety be protected.
