Israel/Occupied Territories: Start of an Amnesty International research mission

As the human rights situation is increasingly deteriorating on an

unprecedented scale, an Amnesty International delegation is leaving

today on a research mission to Israel and the Occupied Territories.

The Amnesty International mission -- the ninth of its kind since

the beginning of the intifada -- will focus on the Israeli Defence Forces'

actions in the Palestinian refugee camps over the last ten days. Amnesty

International's continuing concerns include the unlawful killings of

civilians, arbitrary and mass arrests, the excessive and disproportionate

use of force, house demolitions and closures affecting residents of villages

and towns in the Occupied Territories, in addition to killings carried out

by armed groups.

The delegation is composed is of David Holley, a military expert,

and Elizabeth Hodgkin, a staff member of the International Secretariat

of Amnesty International.
