Up to a dozen Christian people working in Saudi Arabia were arrested between 6 and 17 June 1998, possibly only because of their religious beliefs. Most of them are said to be held incommunicado and may be at risk of torture or ill-treatment.

The detainees were arrested by al-Mutawa'een, the religious police, reportedly after a copy of the Bible was found outside a house in Riyadh. Most of them have apparently been denied any contact with the outside world and their current whereabouts are unknown.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/express/airmail letters in English or your own language:

- calling for immediate clarification of the whereabouts of the Christian workers detained between 6 and 17 June 1998 (name some of them) and seeking assurances that they are treated humanely, protected from torture, and given prompt and regular access to relatives, lawyers and medical attention if necessary;
- expressing concern that the detainees may be prisoners of conscience and, if they are not, seeking information about the reasons for their arrest, any charges brought against them and details of any trial proceedings.
