Youssef Abderrahman, born in 1948

Ali Salem Mohamed Salem El Mami (*alias* Tamek) and Youssef Abderrahman were released on 12 December 1997. They had reportedly been ill-treated.

The two men were arrested on 2 December 1997 in Dakhla, Western Sahara, reportedly in connection with their support for the *Frente Popular para la Liberación de Saguia el Hamra y Río de Oro* (Polisario Front), a movement seeking the independence of Western Sahara.

A communiqué issued by the Association of Families of Victims and Disappeared attributes their release to international intervention, in particular AI.

No further action by the UA Network is requested. However, participants in this action may send letters to the authorities listed in the original Urgent Action:

- expressing concern that Ali Salem Mohamed Salem El Mami and Youssef Abderrahman appear to have been arrested and held in secret detention solely for the non-violent expression of their beliefs;

- expressing concern that they were ill-treated during secret detention; - urging that a full, independent and impartial investigation be carried out into their ill-treatment, that the results of this investigation be made public, and that the perpetrators be brought to justice.
