Abderrahman Brahim Atman and Mohamed El Yaddassia are reported to have "disappeared" after being arrested on 10 December 1997 in Bir Gandouz, in the south of Western Sahara, by members of the Moroccan security forces. Amnesty International fears they may be facing torture or ill-treatment in secret detention.

The two men were reportedly arrested for their support of the *Frente Popular* para la Liberación de Saguia el Hamra y Río de Oro (Polisario Front), a movement seeking the independence of Western Sahara. Their families have no information concerning their whereabouts or legal status.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

During a United Nations-sponsored meeting in Houston, USA, in September 1997, the Moroccan Government and the Polisario Front agreed on a code of conduct during the referendum on the international status of Western Sahara scheduled to take place in December 1998.

The agreement allowed the UN Mission for the Referendum in Western Sahara (MINURSO) to resume the identification of voters in Moroccan-occupied Western Sahara and in the refugee camps which are under the control of the Polisario Front in Tindouf, in the south of Algeria.

However, neither the recent agreement nor MINURSO's current mandate offer any guarantees that human rights will be respected during the period preceding the referendum. In spite of MINURSO's presence in Western Sahara since 1991, dozens of alleged or suspected supporters of the Polisario Front have been arrested and held in secret detention by the Moroccan authorities during which time some have reportedly been ill-treated and tortured.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/airmail letters in Arabic, French, English or your own language:

- calling for the whereabouts of Abderrahman Brahim Atman and Mohamed El Yaddassia, arrested on 10 December 1997, to be made known immediately; - seeking assurances that they are being protected from any form of torture or ill-treatment, and urging that they be allowed immediate access to their families, lawyers and independent medical assistance if necessary; - urging that they be immediately and unconditionally released if they are held for the non-violent expression of their beliefs.
