Amnesty International has received information that prisoner of conscience Abdel Moumen Belanes ended his hunger-strike on 22 December 1997. He had been on hunger-strike since 8 December in protest at his continued detention, the poor conditions of his detention in Nadhor Prison, and the denial of his right to communicate with his lawyers.

Abdel Moumen Belanes has been detained since 6 March 1997 and is serving a one-year prison sentence (imposed on 8 April and confirmed by the appeal court on 4 June) on charges of "disturbing public order". The charge was based on accusations by the authorities that, during a previous period of imprisonment as a prisoner of conscience in 1996, he had said that Tunisian newspapers were full of pictures of the President and Ministers.

Abdel Moumen Belanes has been denied visits from his lawyers since June. This is in violation of Article 70 of the Tunisian *Code de Procédure Pénale* (Code of Penal Procedures), which stipulates that detainees must have access to their lawyers at all times.

UA participants may continue to call for the immediate and unconditional release of Abdel Moumen Belanes as a prisoner of conscience.
