<u>AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL "CARAVAN OF CONSCIENCE" SETS OFF FOR BORDERS OF FORMER YUGOSLAVIA: "STOP THE TORTURE, STOP THE RAPE,</u> <u>Stop the Killings, Bring those responsible to Justice".</u>

On Sunday 16 May two bus loads of Amnesty International members and representatives of organizations, trade unions and religious bodies will leave Ireland to travel across Europe to the borders of the former Yugoslavia. They will be joined en route by Amnesty International members from all over Europe and America, as they travel through Wales, England, France, Belgium, Germany, Austria and Hungary.

They will be taking the message: "**STOP THE TORTURE, STOP THE RAPE, STOP THE KILLINGS, BRING THOSE RESPONSIBLE TO** JUSTICE" to the borders of Serbia and Croatia - a message that will be reinforced at events along the route of their ten-day journey.

Director of Amnesty International's Irish Section, Mary Lawlor, explained that the "Caravan of Conscience" has been set up to publicise this message over and over again in Europe and to let all concerned know that the human rights violations still going on in Bosnia-Herzegovina must end. "We know about the rape, the killings and all the other violations," she said. "It is a terrible burden of knowledge and it brings with it a terrible responsibility.

"That is why we are carrying our concerns physically to the borders of the former Yugoslavia. We must not remain silent - we must raise our voices in protest, even in the face of what seems like the insurmountable."

The caravan will be joined on the borders of Serbia and Croatia by Amnesty International members from Slovenia, Hungary, Poland and Russia for events centred around the rivers Tisa and Drava, which flow through some of the towns which have suffered terribly in the conflict, including Osijek and Vukovar.

They will create a temporary "Republic of Conscience" and Seamus Heaney's poem of the same name will be read - written to commemorate Amnesty International's 25th anniversary in 1986, it is an eloquent statement of human rights principles which transcends politics. Wreaths bearing the names of towns which have witnessed terrible atrocities, will be laid in the Tisa to the sound of a quartet singing "De Profundis". Amnesty International's Secretary General, Pierre Sané, will give a speech and a representative of the Hungarian President will give his message.

People representing other groups, including Jews, Gypsies, lesbians and gays, will come forward, each carrying a flower. They will state who they are and who they represent, they will then throw their flower into the river.

A group of school children will cast white birds made by Irish school children into the river.

<u>Tuesday 18th</u>

Beigium: Brussels - Demonstration outside Ministry of Justice. Symbolic indictment denouncing war crines and impunity and supporting justice will be presented to Minister of Justice, Minister of Foreign Affairs, European Community and United Nations (UN). Amnesty International's Belgian Francophone Section will repeat the call for the ad-hoc war crimes tribunal to bring people to justice, to be just, fair and effective, and to be a first step to the creation of a permanent international criminal court to try gross violations of human rights and humanitarian law. Press conference on bus.

France: Strasbourg - Press conference.

Gormany: Munich - Demonstration at office of Republic of Croatia, General Consulate of Yugoslavia and Consulate of Bosnia Herzegovina.
