Amnesty International sends three-person mission to Kuwait

As part of its ongoing work to maintain an overview of the human rights situation in Kuwait, Amnesty International has sent a three-person delegation on a mission to the country from 13 to 20 May 2012.

Amnesty International routinely visits countries around the world in order to undertake research into human rights developments and this continues to be a normal part of our work.

In light of the ongoing effects of the recent uprisings across the Middle East and North Africa, and the impact these have had on human rights in the region, this is a timely opportunity for Amnesty International to deepen its knowledge of the human rights situation in Kuwait by visiting the country and investigating developments firsthand. Amnesty International last sent a mission to Kuwait in 2004.

The delegates will carry out general research into current developments affecting human rights in Kuwait, including by meeting with a range of relevant groups and individuals.
