'Libya of Tomorrow': What Hope for Human Rights?

*'Libya of Tomorrow': What Hope for Human Rights?*, is an assessment of the human rights situation in Libya, focusing on flaws within Libya's administration of justice, the application of the death penalty and corporal punishment, impunity for past human rights violations and the situation for refugees, asylum-seekers and migrants.

The report highlights the stark contradictions between Libya's lack of progress on implementing advances in human rights and the international role the Libyan authorities seem keen to play.
