Côte d'Ivoire: Arms to shatter a society

Amnesty International and the United Nations Correspondents Association are pleased to invite you to a press conference on Tuesday 19 March at the United Nations to launch the new report, Communities shattered by arms proliferation and abuse in Côte d'Ivoire.

This report focuses on the catastrophic long-term consequences of a series of irresponsible international arms transfers made by a host of countries to the government and opposition armed groups in Côte d'Ivoire immediately before the imposition of a UN Security Council arms embargo in November 2004.

Those weapons contributed to grave human rights abuses, including during the post-election conflict in 2011 and the current armed violence in the country.

The report is being published as all UN Member States meet to negotiate the final text of a historic Arms Trade Treaty that could stop such irresponsible arms transfers in the future.
