All 52 people arrested in October 1995, charged with membership of an illegal organisation and creating a political movement contrary to the law on the formation of political parties, have been acquitted and released.

Twenty-nine of the defendants were acquitted after appearing before the *Tribunal* correctionnelle (Correctional court) in December 1995. The remaining 23 were acquitted after an appeal court hearing in January 1996 where 10 prison sentences (of either six months or a year) and 13 suspended sentences handed out in December were overturned on the grounds of insufficient evidence. The appeal court hearing had been requested by the *Procureur de la République* (public prosecutor) because he considered that the sentences pronounced in December had been too lenient. Defence lawyers had also called for an appeal, saying that the *Tribunal* correctionnelle had prevented them from delivering their full defence speeches.
