The Indigenous Tahltan people of northern British Columbia know the area as the "Sacred Headwaters". Three major salmon-bearing rivers and hundreds of smaller rivers and streams all begin there. The waters are vital to the traditional economy and way of life of the Tahltan and other Indigenous Peoples living downstream.

In December 2008, the Province of British Columbia announced a two-year suspension of Royal Dutch Shell's plans to extract methane from coal beds under the headwaters. The announcement followed widespread protest among the Tahltan and neighbouring communities.

However, this is just one of dozens of large-scale projects planned for the headwaters and surrounding territory. The Tahltan say that not enough is known about the combined effects of this new rush to exploit natural resources. Downstream Indigenous communities haven't even been consulted.

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Dear Premier Campbell.

The headwaters of the Skeena. Nass and Stikine rivers are vital to the culture and economy of the Tahltan People and to other Indigenous Peoples downstream. The combined impacts of the many extractive projects planned for the region must be carefully assessed to ensure that they do not harm these communities and their way of life.

I urge your government to review the licences already granted for exploration and development in the area of the Sacred Headwaters to ensure that none proceeds without a full impact assessment and broad consultation with the Tahltan and downstream communities.

I also urge the Province of British Columbia not to issue further licences in these headwaters until the Tahltan and downstream communities have had the opportunity to develop their own land and resource management plans to protect their rights and ensure a healthy environment.
