A paramilitary death list has reportedly been circulated since CREDHOS secretary Mónica Madero Vergel received telephone death threats, calling for all CREDHOS members to be killed. Amnesty International believes that all members of the organisation are now in grave danger.

The death list, which targets 20 people and organizations, including CREDHOS members and popular activists, is reportedly being circulated by paramilitaries in the Magdalena Medio region. The Office of the Attorney General (Fiscalía General de la Nación), is reported to have recently warned the Commander of the Colombian Armed Forces, General Tapias Stehelin, and the Batallón Nueva Granada, Nueva Granada Battalion, based in Barrancabermeja, of the existence of this list.

An anonymous caller rang Mónica Madero Vergel on 26 August, warning her that she and other CREDHOS workers would be killed if they did not leave Barrancabermeja.

The Colombian authorities have so far failed to take action against paramilitary groups operating in the region. Amnesty International believes that until they do, civilians, peasant farmers and community leaders will face further attacks.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/airmail letters in Spanish or in your own language:

- expressing concern for the safety of Mónica Madero Vergel and other CREDHOS workers after reports that they are named on a paramilitary death list circulating in the Barrancabermeja region;
- urging a full and impartial investigation into the threats against CREDHOS, with the results made public and those responsible brought to justice;
- urging the authorities to take immediate steps to guarantee the safety of CREDHOS members, so they can continue their work;
- calling for a full and impartial investigation into links between the security forces and paramilitary groups operating in Barrancabermeja and the surrounding area, urging that the results are made public and those found responsible for supporting and participating in such groups are brought to justice;
- urging the authorities to take immediate action to dismantle paramilitary groups, in line with stated government commitments and United Nations recommendations.
