Amnesty International report on forced evictions in Haiti's displaced camps

Forced evictions are worsening the already desperate situation of thousands of people still living in Haiti's displacement camps more than three years after the devastating earthquake of January 2010, Amnesty International concludes in a new report out next week.

'Nowhere to go': Forced evictions in Haiti's camps for displaced people will be launched on Tuesday 23 April in Port-au-Prince.

The report is based on three fact-finding visits to Haiti by Amnesty International delegates in 2011 and 2012.
