Amnesty International has learned that Mark Hopkinson's stay of execution is still in force and that further hearings on Mr Hopkinson's case are due to take place in December. Please continue action as recommended

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Express and airmail letters:

- welcoming the stay and urging Governor Sullivan to grant clemency in this case and commute Hopkinson's sentence;
- continuing to express concern at Wyoming's move to resume executions after 25 years and urging that the state not take this retrograde step, citing the world trend toward abolition of the death penalty, and any relevant developments you may know of in your own country.

Letters to newspapers:

- citing other arguments against the death penalty such as its lack of any proven deterrent effect against violent crime and the arbitrariness of its use in practice.
