This discrimination appears in many areas: employment, housing, access to health and access to justice. Many experience physical violence and harassment and discriminatory attitudes of the law enforcement officials and state authorities.

When a transgender woman attempted to complain about police ill-treatment in Alsancak police station, Izmir, she met a familiar response: "He said: Here I take the records. Complain all you want, nothing will happen."

■ Changes to the law and the Constitution. It is time to prohibit discrimination on the grounds of sexual orientation and gender identity and to protect people from the community under comprehensive anti-discrimination legislation.

■ Measures to prevent and ensure effective investigation of suspected homophobic and transphobic attacks.

■ Respect and protection of the rights to freedom of association for all, without discrimination, including on grounds of sexual orientation and gender identity.
