Further information on UA 378/00 (EUR 44/69/00, 13 December 2000) and follow-up (EUR 44/75/00, 21 December 2000) - Fear of torture/possible "disappearance"

Bayla Ba ta (f), aged 20, law student

In their communications with Amnesty International the Turkish authorities have consistently denied that law student Bayla Ba_ta was ever taken into custody. However, Istanbul police have confirmed to a Turkish human rights organisation that she was arrested, charged and imprisoned.

She was released on 25 December, on the orders of a court. There is no information about how she was treated in detention.

When the Human Rights Association (IHD) made enquiries about Bayla Ba_ta, the Justice Ministry told them that she had not been arrested. However, the human rights defenders kept looking for her, and learned that she had been arrested in connection with the prison protests. It seemed that the _i_li district prosecutor in Istanbul had remanded her to Bak_rköy Prison for Women and Children (in Istanbul) on charges of violating the Law on Demonstrations and damaging state property.

On 7 January Istanbul Police Headquarters told the IHD that their information was correct. Bayla Ba_ta and two of her friends had been arrested by the Police Directorate of _i_li on 19 December. The police gave the _i_li prosecutor's investigation number for her as 2000/52701, and the court's number as 2000/570. On 25 December 2000 the i li Court of First Instance No. 7 ordered her release.

No further appeals are required on behalf of Bayla Ba_ta. Many thanks to everybody who contributed to the success of this UA on unacknowledged detention, a practice that increases the risk of torture and "disappearance".

The information on the detainees in Ankara will be updated as soon as possible. In the meantime there is no need for further appeals.
