Amnesty International to publish report exposing the UN failure to investigate Kosovo missing

In its report *Kosovo: UNMIK's Legacy: The failure to deliver justice and reparation to the relatives of the abducted*, Amnesty International slams the UN administration in Kosovo for failing to investigate the abduction and murders of Kosovo Serbs in the aftermath of the 1998-1999 conflict, where they had the responsibility for police and justice until December 2008.

It comes on the eve of a UN Security Council debate on Kosovo on 29 August.

The report calls for the legacies of the Kosovo conflict to be resolved – this includes resolving the fate of missing persons from all communities in Kosovo, bringing to account those responsible for war crimes and crimes against humanity, and providing reparation.
