The eight men named above were executed on 2 January 1997.

Libyan television stated that the eight - six senior army officers and two civilians - were executed after the Supreme Military Court upheld the sentences. The men were reportedly charged with "passing defence secrets to foreign states [the United States of America]" and membership of "a banned organization linked to agents of foreign governments" - the National Front for the Salvation of Libya (NFSL), the main opposition group operating in exile.

The Court acquitted six other army officers, including Lieutenant-Colonel Mohammad al-Ghul and Flight-Captain Sadeq Shaqluf, and two civilians.

The people involved in this case were among dozens arrested in the aftermath of a rebellion by army units around the city of Misrata in October 1993 and held incommunicado in unknown locations. Three of those executed had appeared on television in March 1994 confessing to being US "spies" and that they had been recruited as US intelligence agents by members of the NFSL. They had allegedly been tortured into making these "confessions". Espionage and membership of an opposition group are both punishable by death in Libya.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Participants may send express/airmail letters in English, French, Arabic or in your own language:

- expressing deep concern at the executions of the eight men named above and reiterating unconditional opposition to the death penalty;
- stating that your opposition to the death penalty is purely humanitarian and not politically motivated;
- $\boldsymbol{\mathsf{-}}$ urging the Libyan Government to work towards the abolition of the death penalty for all crimes.
