SAUDI ARABIASheikh Mohammad Ali al-Amri, aged about 90

Sheikh Mohammad Ali al-Amri is reportedly being held incommunicado. The exact reason for his arrest is not known, but appears to be related to his Shi'a religious beliefs. Amnesty International fears that he may be at risk of torture or ill-treatment.

Sheikh Mohammad Ali al-Amri, a Shi'a religious scholar aged about 90, is reportedly detained at the *Mabahith al-Amma*, General Intelligence, in the city of al-Madina al-Munawwarah. He was arrested on 9 March, shortly after some Iranian Shi'a Muslims on pilgrimage (*Hajj*) to Saudi Arabia visited him at his home.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In Saudi Arabia, members of faiths other than Sunni Islam are not permitted to practice their religions in public, and risk arrest even when they do so in private. Arbitrary arrest and detention of Shi'a Muslims is widespread, and fear of prosecution prevents them from practising their faith freely. Those detained are frequently held without charge, and face torture or ill-treatment. In the rare instances where they are brought to trial, the proceedings invariably fail to meet the most elementary standards of fairness.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/airmail letters in or your own language:

expressing concern that Sheikh Mohammad Ali al-Amri is being held incommunicado;
seeking assurances that he is treated humanely, protected from torture or ill-treatment and given prompt and regular access to relatives, lawyers and medical attention;
requesting information regarding his arrest, including the reason for this and whether he has been charged with a criminal offence;
expressing concern that he may have been arrested solely for the peaceful expression of his religious beliefs, and, in that case, calling for his immediate and unconditional release as a prisoner of conscience;
