Amnesty International has received the names of five more people reported to be currently detained incommunicado in connection the prohibited <u>Hizb al-'Amal</u> <u>al-Shuyu'i</u>, Party for Communist Action (PCA). They were reportedly arrested in February 1992 by members of <u>al-Mukhabarat al-'Askariyya</u>, Military Intelligence, shortly after the arrest of 'Abd al-'Aziz al-Khayyir, Bahjat Sha'bu and Khadija Dib. The organization has also learned that Khadija Dib was released after ten days detention.

The five detainees are: 'Abdallah Fadil, a 26-year-old graduate in business studies from Jabla; Muhammad Ghanim, a 34-year-old doctor from Lataqiyya; Mahmud Khadhur, 30 years old, also from Lataqiyya; Nadim Mazlum, from Salmiya near Homs; and Munzir Jum'a, a 32-year-old civil engineer from Homs. All five are said to be held incommunicado in <u>Fara' al-Tahqiq al-'Askari</u>, Military Interrogation Branch, in Damascus. 'Abd al-'Aziz al-Khayyir and Bahjat Sha'bu are also being held there.

Amnesty International fears that all seven detainees are at risk of being tortured. In addition, the organization believes that they may be held solely for the non-violent expression of their political beliefs and as such would be prisoners of conscience.

## RECOMMENDED ACTION: Telegrams/telexes/airmail letters:

- expressing concern at reports that the seven detainees named above are being held and incommunicado and that Amnesty International fears they may be tortured;

- seeking assurances that they are being treated humanely and are not being subjected to torture or ill-treatment;

- requesting that all detainees be given prompt access to their families and lawyers, and that all necessary medical care be provided.

- asking for their immediate release unless they are to be charged with a recognizably criminal offence and given a prompt and fair trial.
