INTRODUSAUN

Submisaun ne'e prepara ba Revizaun Periódika Universál (RPU) husi Timor-Leste iha Janeiru to'o Feveireiru 2021. Iha dokumentu ne'e Amnesty International evalua implementasaun no rekomendasaun sira fó ba Timor-Leste iha nia RPU dahuluk, inklui asuntu liberdade ba espresaun no asembléia pasífika, violénsia kontra feto no labarik-feto sira, direitu ba ema sira ho defisiénsia, no ema sira ho orientasaun sexuál no identidade jéneru diversa, no espresaun no karaterístika séxu sira nian.

Nia mos avalia enkuadramentu nasional ba direitu umanu sira ho hanoin atu hadi'ak liután asesu ba justisa no protesaun ba sasin no vítima sira.

Relasiona ho situasaun direitu umanu iha terenu, Amnesty International hato'o nia preokupasaun kona-bá atuasaun ba pandemia Covid-19 no krize klimátika no halo rekomendasaun sira ho konformidade ba protesaun direitu umanu iha área rua ne'e hotu.

BUKA TUIR (FOLLOW-UP) REVIZAUN DAHULUK

Amnesty International saúda hakat pozitivu sira ne'ebé mák Governu Timor-Leste foti hodi implementa 146 husi 154 rekomendasaun sira ne'ebé nia kompromete ona iha sesaun UPR ida ikus.¹

Timor-Leste seidak kumpre nia kompromisu atu ratifika tratadu adisionál direitu umanu nian iha revizaun ikus liu hanesan Protokolu Opsional ba Konvensaun Kontra Tortura no Tratamentu no Pena Kruél, Dezumanu no Degradante Sira Seluk, Konvensaun ba Protesaun ba Ema Hotu hosi Dezaparesimentu Forsadu, Protokolu Opsional Dahuluk ba Paktu Internasionál kona-bá Direitu Sivil no Política sira, Protokolu Opsional ba Paktu Internasionál kona-bá Direitu Ekonómiku, Sosiál no Kulturál sira, Konvensaun kona-bá Direitu ba Ema sira ho Defisiénsia² no Konvensaun ILO kona-bá Traballadór Doméstika 2011 (No.189).³

Timor-Leste tenke kontinua atu foti hakat sira ne'ebé proteje direitu ba liberdade espresaun liuhosi lei no prátika, proteje individu marjinalizadu sira husi violénsia no diskriminasaun no aseguara direitu ba saúde iha atuasaun sira ba pandemia nian.

Anexu 1 mák matrís ba rekomendasaun sira husi Timor-Leste nia revizaun ida ikus. Husi rekomendasaun sira ne'ebé simu ona, rekomendasaun sira implementa ona sinaliza ho kór matak, sira ne'ebé parsialmente implementa ona sinaliza ho kór kinur, no sira ne'ebé seidak implementa sinaliza ho kór mean.

ENKUADRAMENTU DIREITU UMANU NASIONÁL

Timor-Leste nia konstituisaun inklui Deklarasaun ba Direitu sira ne'ebé garante laiha diskriminasaun ho baze ba kór, rasa, estadu marítal, jéneru, orijen étnika, dalen (lian), estatutu sosiál no ekonómiku, konviksaun polítika no ideolójika, relijiaun (fiar), edukasaun no kondisaun fizika ka mentál.

Timor-Leste iha Instituisaun Nasionál ba Direitu Umanu (INDU), Provedoria ba Direitu Umanu no Justisa (PDHJ) ne'ebé hetan akreditasaun hanesan instituisaun nasionál ba direitu umanu. Iha tinan 2020, PDHJ simu reklamasaun relasiona ho regulamentu emerjénsia sira kona-bá COVID-19 no investiga reklamasaun direitu umanu hamutuk 51 (lima-nulu-resin-ida), relasiona ho militár, polísia, profesór no funsionáriu públiku sira.

Timor-Leste nia tribunál a'as liu tuir Konstituisaun mak Tribunál Supremu, maibé Timor-Leste seidauk kompletamente harii instituisaun ne'e, nune'e duni mák Tribunál Rekursu *de facto* tribunál ne'ebé a'as liu iha nasaun ida ne'e.

Asesu ba justisa nafatin karun no difisil tebes, partikularmente ba sira ne'ebé hela iha área rurál. Diversidade iha dalen ne'ebé ema ko'alia ho dalen ofisial sai hanesan dezafiu hodi aseguza katak lei no prosedimentu legál sira iha dalen ne'ebé ema hotu kumprinde.

SITUASAUN DIREITU UMANU IHA TERENU

LIBERDADE BA ESPRESAUN NO ASEMBLÉIA PASÍFIKA

Timor-Leste ninia kualifikasaun kona-bá liberdade imprensa sa'e di'ak liután iha 2020.⁴ Jornalista sira bele halo sira nia serbisu iha situasaun ne'ebé laiha risku ba prizaun. Maibé, mosu mos preokupasaun ba lei resente balun, inklui lei kona-bá midia ne'ebé promulga iha 2012, no esbosu lei difamasaun iha 2020 no lei rua refere nia impaktu ba liberdade espresaun no mos nia prátika.

Jornalista balun relata katak sira hetan ameasa husi públiku tanba halo kobertura ba kazu kriminal ne'ebé involve akuzasaun abuzu sexuál ba labarik sira kontra Amu-Lulik (Padre) Katóliku (Ne'ebé simu apoiu polítiku no sosiál bo'ot).⁵

Iha Abril, Juñu, Augustu no Setembru 2020, jornalista, estudante no defensor direitu umanu sira protesta no hatama petisaun kontra governu nia planu atu re-introduz lei difamasaun kriminal (iha Kódigu Penál) ne'ebé bele halo indivídu balun hetan akuzasaun no ema hatama ba prizaun tanba de'it sira nia publikasaun iha midia sosiál.⁶ Felizmente, esbosu lei kriminaliza difamasaun ne'e arkiva tiha iha 2020 no seidauk pasa ba lei.

Iha Janeiru 2021, projetu lei sibernética sai proposta lei atu governa rede sosiál no previene propagasaun 'falsidade, kalúnia no difamasaun' ne'ebé bele ameasa direitu ba espresaun iha futuru. Projetu lei ne'e submete ba Ministru sira nia konsiderasaun iha 4 Janeiru 2021 no iha hela prosesu konsulta nia laran.⁷

VIOLÉNSIA KONTRA FETO NO LABARIK-FETO SIRA

Relatóriu kona-bá violénsia bazeia ba jéneru kontinua a'as iha Timor-Leste tuir dadus konfiável ikus hanesan liña-baze-inkéritu (2015) ne'ebé hatudu katak 59% husi feto sira hasoru forma violénsia fizika no sexuál. Wainhira asesu ba justisa liuhosi sistema tribunál, ofisiál judisiál sira fornese de'it sentensa kma'an no falta iha remédiu ne'ebé adekuaudu kontinua sai hanesan dezafiu sistemátiku atuálmente.⁸

Arguidu RD, eis. Amu-Lulik Katóliku ne'ebe diskunfia komete ona ho krime sexuál barak kontra labarik feto sira no julgamentu komesa ona iha 9 Juñu 2021. Iha preokupasaun balun katak suporta política ba nia no interferénsia iha prosesu justisa bele hafraku fali direitu ba julgamentu justu tuir lei direitu umanu no padraun internasionál sira. Iha mos preokupasaun katak atrazu iha prosedimentu sira aumenta ameasa sobrevivente violénsia sexuál sira.⁹

EMA SIRA HO DEFISIÉNSIA

Biar iha kompromisu polítiku no política pública husi governu atu prioriza direitu ema sira ho defisiénsia, maibé melloria substansiál ba direitu ema sira ho defisiénsia oituan tebes, inklui ema sira ne'ebé hasoru problema mental. Ezemplu, Asosiasaun ba Defisiénsia Timor-Leste (ADTL) informa katak 25% ema ho defisiénsia de'it mák hetan asesu ba edukasaun, partikularmente wainhira liu ona nível edukasaun primária.¹⁰

Ema sira ho defisiénsia sira hetan ona prioridade hodi asesu ba vasina COVID-19, maibe ida ne'e seidak bele traduz hanesan avansu iha asesu ba tratamentu no atendimentu saúde sira seluk durante tempu pandemia, partikularmente ba sira ne'ebé iha problema ho asesibilidade.

ORIENTASAUN SEXUÁL, IDENTIDADE JÉNERU, ESPRESAUN NO KARATERÍSTIKA SEXUÁL

Governu Timor-Leste falla ona atu implementa lei, política no prátika sira kompriensivamente, inklui formasaun ba konsiensializasaun hodi asegura laiha diskriminasaun bazeia ba orientasaun sexuál, identidade jéneru ka espresaun no karakterístika sexuál sira. Ministériu sira seidak implementa kompriensivamente formasaun hodi asegura sensibilidade ba asuntu orientasaun sexuál, identidade jéneru, espresaun no karakterístika sexuál. Partikularmente, Ministériu Saúde tenke ativamente envolve ho comunidade atu asegura direitu ba saúde hetan protesaun no respeito hodi laiha diskriminasaun.¹¹

Aktividade entre sexu hanesan sira la hetan kriminalizasaun; maibé, uniaun ka kaben entre sexu hanesan la hetan rekoñesimentu. Laiha lei ne'ebé bele proteje ema husi diskriminasaun ho baze ba orientasaun sexuál, identidade jéneru ka espresaun no karakterístika sexuál sira.

Impaktu importante ida husi falta rekoñesimentu ba relasaun entre sexu hanesan (sira ne'ebé la konsidera iha uma-kain ida) mak sira la hetan hahán no asisténsia monetária sira iha atuasaun ba pandemia nian, nune'e aumenta tan dezigualdade sira ne'ebé iha ona.

Timor-Leste halo nia ORGULLU LGBT (PRIDE) anuál iha Marsu 2017 ho apoiu husi Governu. Tuir mai iha tan pride rua seluk iha 2018 no 2019.

Organizasaun sosiedade sivil CODIVA (Coalition on Diversity and Action – Koligasaun ba Diversidade no Asaun) nota katak membru comunidade transjéneru sira sai vulnerável liu ba violénsia, asédu no diskriminasaun. Estudu iha 2017 dokumenta estupru, abuzu fiziku no psikológiku, ostrasizmu, diskriminasaun no marjinalizasaun ba feto lézbika no biseksuál no mos mane transjéneru.¹²

KUIDADU SAÚDE ADEKUADU NO MEIUS ATUASAUN PANDEMIA COVID-19

Dezde Abril 2020, iha restrisaun oioin, inklui orden hodi hela iha uma no kuarentena ba ema sira ne'ebé halo viajen tama mai Timor husi rai liur hodi bele hanehan propagasaun COVID-19. Governu Timor-Leste implementa estadu emerjénsia husi Marsu to Juñu 2020 no halo tan husi Augustu 2020. Meius estadu emerjénsia agora inklui taka negósiu la-esensiál sira, uza máskara ba oin iha públiku no restrisaun ba viajen doméstika, ho izensaun uitoan de'it.

Biar atuasaun barak ba pandemia ne'e puntuál no apropriadu, puder emerjénsia nian uza mos atu limita movimentu, no asembléia pasífika sira ka atu limita debate públiku no konsulta kona-bá lei no política foun sira.¹³ Polisia Nasionál Timor-Leste ka'er ema liu 200 iha Dili tanba viola restrisaun sira iha Marsu, maibé husik fali sira.¹⁴

To'o 12 Jullu 2021, relata katak Timor-Leste iha 9862 kazu COVID-19 no óbitu 25, iha ne'ebé kazu barak akontese dezde Feveireu 2021.¹⁵ To'o iha 6 Jullu 2021, total 244,497 doze vasina nian mak administra ona, prinsipalmente husi fornimentu fasilidade COVAX nia AMC no mos doasaun husi Nova Zelândia,¹⁶ no mos China.¹⁷

KRIZE KLIMÁTICA NO DIREITU UMANU

Nasaun hotu iha obrigasaun tuir lei direitu umanu internasionál atu proteje direitu umanu husi efeitu a'at liuhosi krize klimátika liuhosi foti medida viável ho sira nia estensaun abilidade másima atu redúz emisaun gas ho efeitu estufa ho períodu ne'ebé posivelmente badak liu. Estadu sira tenke ho objetivu atu mantein aumentu temperatura globál ne'ebé ki'ik liuhosi alvu 1.5°C nível tempu pre-industriál nian, hanesan rekomenda ona husi Painél Intergovernamentál ba Mudansa Klimátika (IPCC). Nasaun sub-dezenvolidu sira hanesan Timor-Leste tenke iha objetivu atu redúz sira nia emisaun ho nível konsistente ho alvu 1.5°C rápidamente tuir sira nia kapasidade idaidak.

Timor-Leste hanesan estadu insular ki'ik oan ida, kontribui ki'ik oan liu 0.003% iha emisaun globál, maibé partikularmente vulnerável ba impaktu husi mudansa klimátika hanesan nível tasi ne'ebé sa'e beibeik no aumentu iha eventu klimátiku sira ne'ebé severu (Siklone no udan bo'ot sira), ne'ebé fó ameasa ba ema nia dalan-moris, meu-moris, no seguransa.

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Iha 2016, Timor-Leste halo ona kompromisu ba alvu adaptasaun no mitigasaun sira, inklui hasa'e dependensia ba enerjia renovável no hadi'ak liután rezilénsia klimátika.¹⁸ Depoizde konsulta iha 2020, Timor-Leste publika Planu Asaun Nasional, maibé falla atu inklui alvu ne'ebé klaru no bele-sukat ba tranzisaun ida ne'ebé justu no sustentável ba enerjia renovável.¹⁹ Timor-Leste halo desizaun ida ne'ebé konsiente atu laiha alvu ba redúz emisaun. Projetu hamutuk ho Governu Australia, ne'ebé regula ho akordu bilateral ida ba estrasaun no kombustaun gas no petróleu natural ba setór enerjética mák sai hanesan fonte emisaun bo'ot liu iha nasaun (70% husi emisaun enerjética tomak), tuir mai mák setór agrikultura.

AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL APELA BA GOVERNU TIMOR-LESTE ATU:

ENKUANDRAMENTU DIREITU UMANU NASIONÁL

- Adere ba tratadu direitu umanu sentrá restante sira no inkorpora sira iha lei doméstika
- Emite konvite permanente ida ba Prosedimentu Espesiál Nasoins Unidus nian no koopera kompletamente ho komunikasaun hotu ho sira.
- Kumpre obrigasaun ezistente sira hodi apresenta relatóriu ba orgaun tratadu sira hanesan prioridade no asegura katak sei halo submisaun ba relatóriu sira iha futuru tuir tempu ho envolvimentu no konsulta ho sosiedade sivil ne'ebé apropiadu.

LIBERDADE BA ESPRESAUN NO ASEMBLÉIA PASÍFIKA

- Abstein husi aprova lei foun sira (hanesan ezbosu difamasaun kriminal ka lei seguransa dijitál sira) ne'ebé kriminaliza direitu ba liberdade espresaun no asegura katak lei foun sira konsistente ho direitu internasionál direitu umanu nian no Artigu 40 no 41 husi Timor-Leste nia Konstituisaun (kona-bá direitu ba liberdade espresaun no liberdade imprensa).

VIOLÉNSIA KONTRA FETO NO LABARIK FETO SIRA

- Asegura katak keixa kriminal sira kona-bá violénsia kontra feto no labarik feto sira hetan investigasaun ne'ebé klean no bainhira iha evidénsia ne'ebé suficiente, lalais prosesa tuir lei no direitu ba julgamentu justu, no laiha tratamentu preferensiál ba autór bazeia ba sira nia pozisaun ka estatutu sosiál.
